Accomplishments: Zak is the recipient of the 2010 Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup Award. This award honors a collegiate and/or professional athlete who has made the greatest positive influence in the lives of others. Boggs was one of the finalists for the Lowes Senior CLASS Award, was named to the Lowes Senior CLASS All-Senior All America First Team and the winner of the fan voting for the Lowes Senior CLASS Award. This outstanding soccer athlete was selected to the 2009 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Men's Division I All-Northeast Region First Team and he also tabbed an All-BIG EAST Conference third team selection. In this past season, Boggs finished the year sixth on the team in scoring with nine points off of four goals and one assist. He tied for first on the team in most game winning goals with three and was first on the team in shots on goal with 19. For his efforts, Boggs was recently selected in the second round of the Major League Soccer Super Draft by the New England Revolution. In his free time, Boggs regularly volunteers with programs such as the John and Mabel Ringling Museum of Art in Sarasota Bay, as well as the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center & Research Institute and Shriners Hospital for Children. Zak serves as an academic tutor to his fellow student-athletes at the University of South Florida. Mr. Boggs has completed his undergraduate degree of Biomedical Sciences at USF early with a 4.0 and is currently working on his graduate degree in Economics and Marketing.
